Uniform


Finally, the weather is improving! Some children are now in summer dresses and shorts which is so lovely to see. However, cropped t-shirts and very short shorts are not suitable for school uniform or PE. If children continue to wear these items for school, we will provide items for them to wear for the day and they will be expected to change into borrowed clothes.























Please check what your children are wearing when they leave for school. School t-shirts should be plain white or blue with no patterns or designs.

Earrings – many children are wearing earrings that are not suitable for school. This is due to safety at playtimes and in PE. Earrings easily 'snag' on clothing, other children or equipment such as ropes, hoops and gymnastic mats. The only earrings that are suitable for school are stud earrings. Staff will ask children to remove other earrings as this is important for the safety of all. Again, please check what earrings your children are wearing as they leave for school.

I just wanted to inform you that Whitwell Parish Council will be holding the Summer Playscheme in our school during the first 3 weeks of the 6 weeks holidays. This is staffed by members of the local community and also by members of the school community who work at the Playscheme as well as in school during term-time.
