


Key Vocabulary

Season	Once of the four parts of the year, Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter.
Spring	The time of year between March and May. Usually lots of new growth in Spring.
Summer	Usually the warmest season in the UK. June through to August.
Autumn	September through to November. Many leaves fall off the trees.
Winter	Usually the coldest season in the UK. December through to February.
Weather	A description of the outside environment such as sunny and warm.
Thermometer	 An instrument that measures temperature.
Temperature	How hot or cold it is, measured using a thermometer.
Evergreen	The name given to trees that do not lose their leaves in autumn. They are green all year round.
Deciduous	The name given to trees that lose their leaves in the Autumn and grow new ones in Spring.

In this topic we will be focussing on naming the seasons, finding out key facts about them and how the weather changes throughout the year.

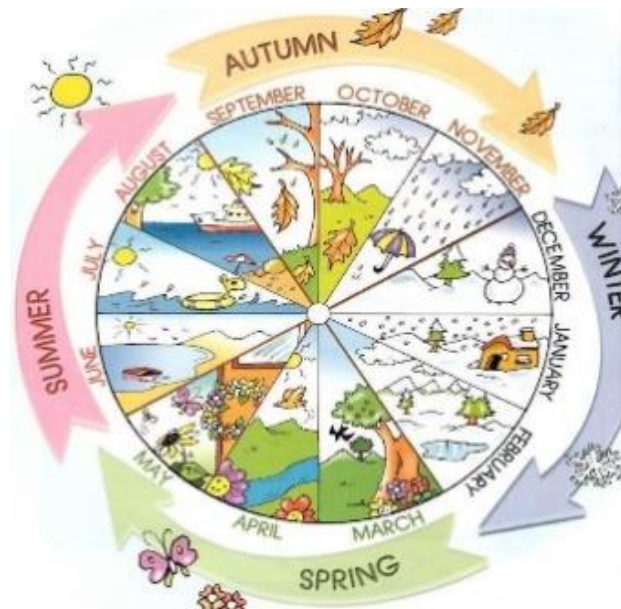

Key Facts

1. In the UK we have four seasons. Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter.
2. Summer is the warmest season in the year and Winter is the coldest season.
3. In Autumn deciduous trees lose their leaves.
4. In Spring deciduous trees grow new leaves and blossom.
5. In the UK June 21st is the longest day of the year, with the most hours of daylight. December 21st is the shortest day with the fewest hours of daylight.
