Personal, Social, Emotional Development

- Develop friendship with other children.
- Enjoy playing alongside and with special friends.
- Begin to understand the need for simple rules.
- Able to put on my coat and shoes with help.
- Able to talk about how they are feeling and begin to understand others feelings.

Communication and Language

- Listen to familiar stories and rhymes.
- Pay attention to more than one thing at a time with support.
- Understand simple questions such as what, where and when.
- Begin to use more complex sentences to link thoughts.
- Retell a simple past event in the correct order.

Physical Development

- Join in with our Get Set 4 PE lessons.
- Begin to show a preference for a dominant hand.
- Begin to experiment with moving in different ways.
- Take part in fine motor activities to develop muscles.
- Use our large outdoor area and equipment to develop gross motor.

Literacy

- Enjoy looking at books independently.
- Enjoy listening to a range of books.
- Give meaning to drawings.
- Make marks to represent their name.
- Able to join in with singing, rhymes and copying sounds.
- Recognise my own name.
- Show awareness of rhyme and alliteration.

Read, Write, Inc Phonics

- Able to match environmental sounds to visuals.
- I can answer simple questions about events.
- I know that stories have a sequence.

Maths

- Recognise some numerals.
- Join in with counting songs and rhymes.
- Recognise numbers of personal significance.
- Recognise up to two objects, without having to count them individually.
- Say one number for each item in order: 1,2,3,4,5
- Say which group has more or less.
- Be aware of the sequence of events in everyday life and stories.
- Understand position through words alone.

Understanding the World

- Talk about what they see, using a wide range of vocabulary.
- Enjoy playing with small world reconstructions, building on first hand experiences.
- Continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.
- Show interest in different occupations.
- Begin to have their own friends.
- Enjoy stories about people and the world.
- Talk about some of the things I have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Enjoy experimenting with paint, chalk and other media to make marks.
- Able to move body to different styles of music.
- Explore and learn how sounds can be changed.
- Join in with familiar songs and rhymes.
- Take part in simple pretend play, using sounds, movements, words and objects.
- Make toys work by pressing parts or lifting flaps.
- Make marks and represent objects.
- Move in response to music, stories and ideas.
